

Fishing the Tenkara Way with Art Strauss

rt Strauss, a member of the Long Beach Casting Club since 2012, is a native of San Diego. He started fly fishing while in college in San Diego State and the UC Irvine School of Medicine. His love of fly fishing grew in the June Lake area where he has fished over a period of thirty years. His fishing adventures have not been limited to just the Sierras. His largest fish caught on a fly was a 35 pound Dorado that took him 45 minutes to land! This was caught at Loreto Bay, Baja Sur, Mexico where he has a home.

Some very prominent fly fishers and casters have said that Tenkara is a fad that will soon pass way. Well, 200 years of fishing the Tenkara way in Japan does not seem like a fad to me. It also harkens back to the earliest forms of fly fishing here in America only then it was called "dapping".

Art has developed an interest in Tenkara over the last several years and takes his Tenkara gear whenever he travels if there are streams or ponds nearby. He says "Bluegill are a blast on a Tenkara rod". Although traditionally, Tenkara rods and flies were used only for trout, now you can find reports of catching steelhead and bonefish on Tenkara rods as interest spreads across the globe."

Most recently, Art demonstrated how to tie Tenkara style flies at our Wednesday night fly tying work shop. We are very fortunate to have Art Strauss on Thursday October 29 to share with us his knowledge of the history of Tenkara, its equipment including rods, line, leaders and flies, fishing techniques, and a resource list of books, websites etc.

national organization and as Assistant Program Lead of the Long Beach program. He helped with fishing outings, taught fly casting classes, and of course taught the Royal Wulff class. He led the rod building classes one season and gave a variety of talks over the years. He helped with fundraisers. Jeff set up a day of tying flies in the clubhouse to later be sold for PHWFF. During one Fred Hall Show Jeff worked all day, every day, in charge, because I wasn't able to be there at all due to my husband's health.

"During a trip to the San Gabriel in 2007 when we were working with a group of veterans with mental illness, Jeff was helping one who never talked. Jeff taught him how

to cast and get a good drift. The vet caught 7 fish; the others caught none or one. Jeff's vet had the biggest possible smile every time we saw him after that. His doctor said to me a few weeks later: 'I don't know what you gave him, but I want 300 doses for the rest of my patients.' Thank you, Jeff.

"Like me, Jeff got choked up when talking about our PHWFF program. He was so proud of what we have done

in Long Beach, something he could clearly appreciate after having been on the national board. Jeff Sadler was intelligent, generous, capable, clear-headed and fun. His passing will be a tremendous loss to LBCC, to Long Beach PHWFF and to me personally. We are all better for having had him in our lives."







Fly of the Month: Late Season Rigging with Tiny Flies

A swe make our way towards fall and on into winter, it's time to consider some different ways to catch trout with the tiny flies that inhabit the stream at this time of the year. Years ago I learned a way to entice large trout to take very small flies on the Williamson River in southern Oregon. Now I have taken that same system and updated it with some easier to use components that can easily and quickly be adapted to other uses.


Those of you who have fished during this time of year (especially on the Owens and Hot Creek), have seen fish rising freely and yet, when you present a variety of dry flies to them, they reject your offerings. Obviously they don't like what you are offering but it may also be the fact that, while they are looking up, they ain't looking that far up and eating just beneath the surface. Emerging small mayfly duns and midges are what's hatching and now you need a new way to fool the trout. Here's what has worked for me...

Why not give the fish two choices instead of one. Nope, I don't mean two dry flies or two nymphs—I'm talking about one of each by using a nymph rig and dry dropper but using tiny stuff and a few slight twists. On the Green river this spring I used this rig one afternoon and got a lot of fish and the distribution was about 50-50 between the dry and nymph. The flies that I used were a size #20-24 Upright BWO and my favorite nymph, the Halo, with a copper colored tungsten bead in size #20. Yup, pretty small stuff but, then again, so

were the flies that were hatching. You can find both patterns in past issues of Target Talk (HALO in April, 2012 & UPRIGHT BWO CRIPPLE in March, 2015).

I start this rig with a 12 feet monofilament leader that tapers to 3x. In the past where I used to tie in a Perfection or Surgeon's loop I now tie on a small (2mm) tippet ring using a Clinch knot. These rings are soooo much faster than dropper loops and create less drag on the water. I then tie on 4 feet of 4x tippet and another tippet ring with a Clinch knot. You can now attach your dropper dry with 6x tippet. Tie in 12" of 5x and Blood Knot or Double Surgeon's knot this to 12"–18" of 6x tippet for your nymph. Only if you nymph does not have a tungsten bead head then add a small split shot where the 5x and 6x are joined.

Add a small "pinch-on" foam strike indicator just above the upper tippet ring and you're ready to go. Fish the rig just like a dry fly but keep your eyes on the dry and the indicator!



Casting Instructors' Workshop

his year's Casting Instructors' Workshop will be held on Saturday, September 26, 2014. The workshop will begin at 8:00 AM and wrap-up about 12:00 PM

As always, the purpose of the Workshop is to set the standards of instruction and to facilitate the creation of a learning environment in which all the instructors are on the same page. To accomplish this goal, the Workshop will review the three basic casts taught in the Beginning Clinic, with special focus on casting essentials, common faults and comprehensible fixes.

For a couple of reasons, Workshop attendance will again be mandatory for all Beginning Casting Clinic instructors. First, we want to help each volunteer become a more effective instructor. For example, it turns out the reason for wind knots has very little to do with wind and very much to do with the path of the rod tip. Knowing the relationship between rod tip path and loop formation, together with a systematic method of diagnosis, will help instructors help their students.

Second, we need to know who will be teaching in order to create four balanced groups of instructors. We hope this "one and done" approach will make it easier for club members to take part in the annual event that draws so many participants to the Long Beach Casting Club. No prior registration is necessary. Workshop participants need only to show up at on Saturday, September 26. Please contact Bob Middo or John Van Derhoof with any questions or concerns.


