The Owens trip has been so successful because we really have a great time. We meet for dinner each night and share stories of the days fishing in the evening.


For those of you who think that the Lower Owens does not provide enough of a challenge, there will be a one fly contest on Saturday. Bring your best fly and join us.



Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing



Fly of the Month: Steelhead Slider

One of the greatest thrills in fly fishing is the rise of a steelhead or salmon to a waking or skating dry fly. It is the culmination of a near perfect set of circumstances. First, the fish needs to be there (duh!) and usually the water temperature needs to be a bit warmer than normal. Then, the angler must make a precise cast with a bulky, wind-resistant fly and adeptly mend the line so that it slides over the fish at just the right speed. If the fly travels too slowly it may go unnoticed or sink in the current. If it goes too quickly it will either spook your quarry or get dragged below the surface. So, considering all of that, are you ready for a fly that will take out some of the variables?

Enter the Steelhead Slider, a fly that is easy to cast and virtually unsinkable under tension! This fly works on the reverse of the principle that makes Larry Dahlberg's famous Dahlberg Diver dive. The collar of a Dahlberg diver acts as a wing that pulls the fly below the surface. The collar of the Steelhead Slider lifts the fly to the surface and keeps it there with only the slightest amount of tension on the line and fly. The wings of the fly add to the effectiveness by creating a well-formed wake even at slow speeds.

This is a pattern that can be tied in a wide variety of sizes and colors. For steelhead and salmon tie the fly in sizes #8 through #4. The colors that seem to best are pale yellow or orange with a natural tan or brown collar and a black body with a black collar. Smaller sizes such as #10 through #16 and more natural colors can be used to imitate grasshoppers or egg-laying caddis for trout. I introduced a trout version of this fly to my friends Gary LaFontaine and Craig Mathews years ago at a fly tiers get together in Hamilton, Montana. Gary was so impressed after we fished it that morning on the Beaverhead that it became a staple in his fly box and was even included in his book The DRY FLY (GREYCLIFF, 1990).

So take it out for a try and enjoy!

Materials for tying the Steelhead Slider:

Thread: Hook:	Black 6/o or 8/o Low water or dry fly salmon hook; size	e
Body:	Hot orange synthetic seal hair substitute (or color as desired) with fine oval gold tinsel	
Underwing:	Fluorescent orange Krystal Flash strands (or color as desired)	
Wing:	Golden pheasant tail lightly coated with Flexament	
Collar:	Deer or elk hair tied on as a collar, coated with Flexament and trimmed into a semi- fan shape	
Head:	Black thread	1



Instructions for tying the Steelhead Slider:

- Attach the thread to the hook to the shank directly behind the return of the looped eye. Wind the thread up onto the looped eye and close it off but leave about 2 headspaces distance from the eye. Now advance the wind the thread down to the bend in the shank.
- 2 Tie in the oval gold tinsel on the far underside of the hook. Apply the dubbing to the thread and wind it forward to the end of the looped eye. Wind the tinsel 3 turns next to each other to form a tag and then continue to wind forward 5 evenly spaced

turns and tie it off on the underside of the hook.

3 Cut off left and right sections of the golden pheasant

tail wing. They should be about 3/8" wide for a #6 fly. Brush a small amount of Flexament onto the wing, wipe off the excess with your fingers, and set aside to dry. Tie in about 20 strands of Krystal Flash that extends to the end of the body. Tie the wings in one at a time. They should be flat as possible forming a "V" with the point of the tips outward and extending to just beyond the bend.

- 4 Tie on a partial collar of deer or elk hair. The tips will be on top of the wing and should extend to the end of the body and the hair should not be on the underside of the hook. Stand the butt ends straight up with a couple of turns of thread. Spin on 1 or 2 sections of deer hair over the bare section of the looped eye and make sure that you leave enough room for a small head. Wind the head of the fly and whip finish.
- 5 Trim the underside of the hair collar very close to the hook but without cutting any of the thread wraps that secure it. Brush a small amount of Flexament onto the face of the collar and allow it

to dry until it is tacky. At this point squeeze the hair together into a fan shaped the top of which should cant toward the eye about 20 to 30 degrees. Apply

more Flexament to the face of the collar and allow it to dry until it is tacky. When it is tacky once again squeeze the hair together and trim collar into a fan shape the height of which should not exceed the gape of the hook.

Allow the fly to dry overnight before taking it to your favorite place to try it out fishing.
