Fly Fishing the Lower Owens & Eastern Sierras with Pat Jaeger

STEVE GONZALEZ, 1ST VICE PRESIDENT

Pat Jaeger has fished and explored the Eastern Sierra for over 30 years. His journey began when he moved to Mammoth Lakes in 1978.

In 1980, he became part-owner of the Trout Fly fly shop in Mammoth Lakes. His passion turned into a profession after serving an internship at the Clearwater House on Hat Creek and a partnership with Eastside Guide Service in 1995.

Pat is a proud dad of two beautiful girls, a husband and currently the owner/operator of the Eastern Sierra Guide Service. He logs over two hundred days a year on the water. While his guiding is based out of the Mammoth Lakes area, he also spends a month on the McCloud River and six weeks in Oregon guiding for Steelhead on the Rogue River.

Pat's main objective as a guide and teacher is to simplify the techniques for the person entering the world of fly fishing and to defy the most advanced of angler in the trout-infested waters in the West.

His presentation will describe the in's and out's of the river we fish and impart the simple tactics he uses to trick trout. He will shed light on the facts of weather, water flows and hatches that create this world-class fishery. Pat will answer the question why a drift boat is the perfect off-road vessel for exploring the trout infested water of the Lower Owens River.

He will also describe other year-round waters that the Eastern Sierra has to offer and help us plan our next fishing adventure this winter, spring and summer.

Pat says that his presentation is not a big "fish



holding" commercial but an educational, factual, maybe humorous, visual tour of the waters that we know and love. His power-point presentation will confirm that we should not sit around a clubhouse or wood-burning stove tying flies and dreaming about the warm days of summer during winters in the Eastern Sierras.

- ❖ Master nymph rig techniques (Yash)

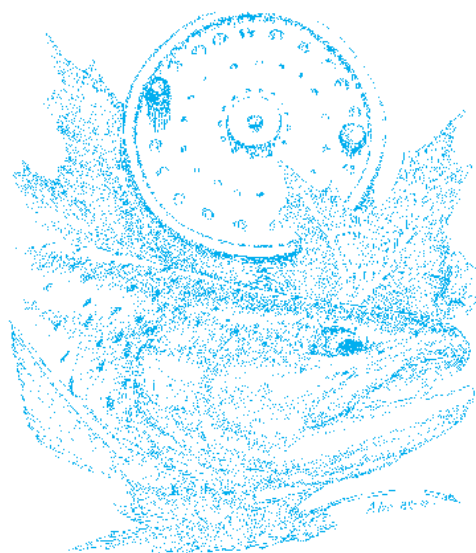
- ❖ Soft hackle & streamers (Danny)

Well 2015 was a record year for the club's Endowment Fund. We started with \$11,082 in our Vanguard account and ended the year with \$21,144, a gain of \$10,062, or just a bit over a 90% increase. The growth can be attributed to a generous \$5,000 matching funds grant by Art Strauss. A number of members stepped up and collectively met the challenge.

The Endowment was founded several years ago from the initial efforts of Howard Uller who spent much of his career establishing endowments that greatly benefitted some of his other organizations.

The Endowment is invested with Vanguard Financial and all returns are reinvested to help the fund grow as quickly as possible. When it reaches to a significant amount, say, \$100,000, the dividends can be used to offset operating expenses like water and electricity. That may be a few years way, but we're making progress.

If only the founders had started such a program 90 years ago... Or even fifty.

A STRONG START...

Now, 2016 begins with Good News. Art has confirmed that he will again offer a matching funds challenge for the same amount—\$5,000. We have approximately 400 members. At just \$12.50 per member, we can easily meet the challenge again.

Fly of the Month: Bead-Head Bird's Nest

If you are like me you are always looking for a pattern that is quick to tie and also very effective. Cal Bird's Nest fits nicely into this category. It has been around 30 years or more now and, like a lot of Cal's patterns, it seems to get more popular as time goes on.

This fly's effectiveness is probably the result of it being quite generic in shape and materials. When tied with a shaggy and spiky body it has a lifelike and buggy quality that seems irresistible to fish. I have a couple of Bird's Nests tied by Cal in various sizes and they all have this quality. It is suggestive of mayfly, dragonfly, damselfly and stone fly nymphs depending upon the size or color that you tie it in. It is also a very popular steelhead pattern on the American, Klamath and Trinity Rivers just to name a few.

The fly materials listed are the originals as best as I can determine. I have added the bead head, which I prefer, to a leaded body as I think it fishes better. Do not hesitate to change colors or materials to fit your needs. If you do not have any Australian opossum then a hare's mask will work very nicely and the same can be said for the wood duck vs. dyed mallard or even partridge.

I think you will find the Bead Head Bird's Nest a great addition to your fly box. It is a versatile pattern, easy to tie and tough on fish.

Materials for tying the Bead Head Bird's Nest:

- Hook: Standard nymph hook similar to Mustad 3906B with a bead or use a 3906 without a bead in sizes 18 to 6
- Head: Gold metal bead in a size to match with the hook; use tungsten if more weight is needed
- Thread: Tan or brown 6/0 or 8/0
- Tail: Wood duck flank or dyed mallard flank to match
- Body: Australian opossum with guard hairs or darkish hare's mask
- Ribbing: Copper wire
- Hackle: Wood duck flank or dyed mallard flank to match; you can also substitute light partridge body feathers
- Thorax: Australian opossum with guard hairs or hare's mask.



Instructions for tying the Bead Head Bird's Nest:

- 1 Flatten the barb on the hook and slip the bead onto the hook and slide it forward to the head. Attach the thread to the hook just behind the bead create a small jam to anchor the bead and wind smoothly back to the bend. Remove 3 to 8 fibers from a wood duck flank feather and tie them in and binding the butts down along the length of the shank. The number of fibers depends on the size of the hook and they should be the length of the shank or a little less. Attach a length of copper wire on the back side of the hook at the point where the tail is tied in.
- 2 Remove the dubbing from the hide being sure to include the guard hairs and apply it to your tying thread. Wind the dubbing forward forming a body that is a little thicker than normal. The body should end leaving a small space between it and the bead head. Wind the copper wire forward in the reverse direction of the body about 4 to 6 turns and tie off.
- 3 Remove 12 to 20 fibers (depending on your hook size) from your wood duck flank feather and carefully fan them around the shank with your winding hand. They should be a little shorter than the body. Switch hands so that you are now holding the hackle with your off hand and bind them down using the loose loop method anchor them securely. By attaching the hackle in this fashion you can better control the hackle length.
- 4 Apply a small amount of dubbing to your thread and wind a couple of turns forward the remaining distance to the bead thus forming the thorax. Whip finish and apply a small amount of thin head cement to the wraps.
- 5 Using your dubbing needle, pick out the body and the thorax creating a buggy, spiky look to your fly.
