Lower Owens Trip Prep - Recommended Flies

appy Holidays to all! Now is the time to prepare for the upcoming trips, including to the Lower Owens River. I checked my fly boxes for flies that worked well in the past few years and began tying replacements. Then, I wondered: what flies do other members use? Hope the following will be useful to anyone wondering which flies to use in the Lower Owens River. A few members that regularly fish the Lower Owens River in January, February, and March sent a list of their "go to" flies:

- ❖ YASH ISEDA: Zebra Midge #18–20; Double Midge #18-20, Pheasant Tail #18–20; Partridge & Green #18; Kobe Killer #10–12.
- ❖ WAYNE SAKAGUCHI: Elk Hair Caddis #18; Sakaguchi's Dark Blue Soft Hackle #14, 16, & 18.
- JOHN LINCOLN: Zebra Midge #18; Black Pheasant Tail #18.
- ❖ Joe Libeu: Olive Midge #16; Green Rock Worm #16; Pheasant Tail bead head with flashback #16-18; Gray RS2 #16; Baetis #18.
- MARK FLO: Zebra Midge #18; Sexy Walt's Worm #12 & 14; BWO #16−18.
- ❖ JOHN VAN DERHOOF: SnoCone black with copper wire #18 & 22; Halo #16-20; Black/Silver and Red/ Silver \$3 Dip #18 & 20; R.A.M. Caddis Olive wire body/Silver wire rib #14-18; Upright BWO #18-24; Blue Ribbon's Twisted Midge #20-24; Griffith's Gnat #18-22; Partridge & Peacock #16-18; Sakaguchi's Partridge and Blue #16-18; Koby Killer #16-18.

- ❖ SAN SASI: Grey Zebra Midge silver bead, blue wire #18; Pheasant Tail with pink Ice Dub thorax #16; Hi-Viz Zelon Midge#18−20; BWO Cripple w/ Zelon wing #16−18.
- ❖ COLIN KUMABE: WD-40 #18-22, Copper/Black Zebra Midge #18-20, Flashback Pheasant Tail #16-20, Blue Winged Olive #16-20, Elk Hair Caddis #16-20, Partridge and Green #14-18, Partridge & Yellow #14-18.

Now, how to fish them and where? Having the right flies is just the first step. However, fishing with the club members during the upcoming Lower Owens River trip will help everyone to know where and how to fish these flies.

Most of all, practice your casting at the Pond. See you at the Pond!



Dear Colin,

I want to thank you for your support of the Southwest Council (SWC) and Fly Fishers International (FFI). As you know, the SWC is the collective voice of the clubs and unites all fly fishers in our regions. SWC does not charge dues as your dues to the FFI automatically make you a member of the SWC. Your membership to the FFI supports the FFI programs and staff. Unfortunately, it does not financially support the individual councils, including the SWC. This is where we need your help. We rely solely on fundraisers and donations from our members and the community to do the work we do.

As a unified voice for Southern California and Nevada, the SWC can influence the FFI on important conservation issues such as the Lahonton Cutthroat Restoration project on Silver Creek. This Summer, we installed an interpretive panel on Silver Creek from grants received from FFI and Western Native Trout Initiative (WNTI). This was the culmination of earlier efforts that the council assisted in removing Brookies from the stream and re-introducing Lahontans.

Another important aspect of the council is to assist our clubs with their Trout in the Classroom (TIC) projects. Rich Bollinger, our TIC chair, has been instrumental in keeping our clubs in contact with the Dept. of Fish and Wildlife (DFW). DFW has stepped up and provided most of the equipment to make TIC a success. Our clubs provide the assistance in procuring eggs, setting up the equipment, training the teachers, and helping to release the fry. This program has literally impacted the lives of thousands of our children from 7-12 years of age and, most importantly, to engage and encourage the appreciation of our fish, their habitat, and the "catch & release" ethic that the fly fishing community embraces.

We need your help and support through donations to make sure the SWC can continue to provide and support the fly fishing programs throughout Southern California and Nevada.

The SWC Board of Directors is made up of sixteen volunteers. They put in over 200 hours per month planning and executing events and programs like the Fly Fishing Faire, FlyBuy, The Fred Hall Show, Riptide Rendezvous, Casting Instruction, and Fly tying demonstrations. We also have supporting programs and organizations that provide unique fly fishing opportunities such as Trout in the Classroom, Project Healing Waters (PHW), and Casting for Recovery (CFR).

An emphasis in getting more women involved with fly fishing was directed by Karen Hall, our Women's Program Chair. Karen organized workshops, retreats, even a Fashion Show hosted by Orvis. Looking among our clubs, I think that you can visually see an increase in women participation of our sport.

Carl Crawford, our Youth Chair, has implemented a great program serving urban youths in introducing Fly Fishing and an outdoor experience. We partner with Outward Bound and instruct young teens in the art of fly fishing. SnowbeeUSA has been an active supporter in providing the equipment and Frank Burr, member of PCC and VP of SnowbeeUSA, has provided the guidance to the youths.

The SWC is aware that people know where to go to learn tennis or golf but learning about Fly fishing is harder to find and we are continually working to create more visibility for our Fly Fishing community. We run advertising campaigns, use print (Western Outdoor News, California Fly Fishers) radio (KLAC, San Diego Let's Talk Hook-up including on-air interviews about fly fishing) and social media. We also use our liaisons with fly fishing related manufacturers and retailers to help support co-op advertising to keep our costs as low as possible.

I will be contacting all of the club presidents over the next 30 days to arrange a personal message to all the clubs. The FFI has gone through some significant changes within the last two years, not just in their name, but also in the programs it is offering to its members and the public. Casting, Fly Tying, Conservation activities, and Education all have something new to offer our members and I'd like to bring that information to each of your clubs.

So, enjoy your holidays, travel safely, and have a great time on your next opportunity to Fly Fish! Every \$Dollar\$ you give to the Southwest Council goes directly to the work of your Council and all that we do. As a registered 501 (C)(3), any donation is tax deductible! Thank you for your support and generosity.



Fly of the Month: Twisted Midge

kay, 'tis the season. Many of you are getting all ready to go out and freeze your collective tails off during the next three months attending the Club's annual Lower 'O' trips. Most of you do realize that it is winter and that you are up around 4,200 feet in elevation where it does actually get cold. Most of your time in the water will be spent looking at an indicator or a sighter but all of you will be hoping to see rings appear on the surface. No, not rain, rising fish! Will they be BWOs or the dreaded midge hatch—those tiny things that are almost impossible to see and tough to tie? Well, I have an easy option for you...the Twisted Midge.

Midges are everywhere. They inhabit every stream and lake that you fish and the winter and early spring is their time to shine. Sure there are other bugs out there but really it's only midges (and maybe a few BWOs) that are crazy enough to hatch when it is butt cold out blowing snow or driving sleet. Sadly, they are generally pretty small but this month's pattern is an easy fly to tie and offers you a different way from normal to create a body. Oh, and by the way, it works!

The Twisted Midge is one of the simplest of dry flies to tie and one of the most popular midge patterns sold at Blue Ribbon Flies. It is also tough as nails and floats remarkably well. All you need are tiny hooks and magnifiers and you can tie these down to #26!

When fishing really small sizes tie on a #18 Griffith's Gnat first (or a Madison Buzzer; see the April 2018 Target Talk) and then add 12" of 6x to the bend of that hook and tie on a Twisted Midge. The lead fly will give something easier to see and all you need to do is set the hook on any rise you see nearby.

So tie up a few before heading off to Bishop. They really do work well and if those fish are rising to something you can't see, this fly should be your salvation!

MATERIALS FOR TYING THE TWISTED MIDGE:

Hook: Tiemco 2488 or Daiichi 1130 in

sizes #20 to #26 (for sizes smaller than #22 you might need to use a

Tiemco 100 or 101 or similar).

Thread: Black or a color to match the

natural.

Body: Light dun Zelon twisted into a rope

and tied in as an extended body.

Wing: Pale Morning Dun EP Triggerpoint

Fibers.

Thorax: Blue Ribbon's Glossosoma Zelon

dubbing (black fine with red

Zelon).

Head: Black or a color to match the

natural.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR TYING THE TWISTED MIDGE:

- 1 Place your hook in the vise, attach your thread behind the headspace and wind about half way down the shank. Now it's time to twist the body... Take hold of about a dozen or so strands of Zelon (I use Darlon which tends to be a bit finer and straighter) that are about 4" to 5" in length. Pull and twist the Zelon very tightly using the thumb and index fingers of each hand. Each hand will twist in the opposite direction of the other to get the Zelon into a single twisted rope. Once the Zelon is about as tightly twisted as you can get it, move your hands closer together and allow the rope to coil on itself. You now have a durable body that you can use for any extended body-style fly: stone flies, damsel flies, mayflies, you name it.
- 2 With your extended body prepared, tie it onto the hook with the cut ends of the body towards the eye of the hook. If you do it the other way it will just untwist—OOPS! The length of the extended body should be a little longer than the bend of the hook.
- 3 Advance the thread to the middle of the thorax. Cut off a clump of Pale Morning Dun EP Triggerpoint Fibers and tie them in lying flat like a mayfly spinner wing using 'X' wraps. Once secure, pull both wings straight back and cut the excess at about the bend of the hook. Don't cut your extended body though!
- Move your thread back towards the tie-down point of the body and apply your dubbing to the thread. Midges have very distinct legs so the dubbing you wind should be a bit on the rough side; resist the temptation to "clean it up". Wind the dubbing one turn behind the wing and then diagonally, completely around where the wings are tied in. By winding over the top and underside of the wings you cover a hole that could occur on the underside. On larger flies you might even want to 'X' wrap the wing with dubbing. Continue forward a turn or two in front of the wing. Form



a small, smooth head and whip finish. If you do a good job with the whip finish you probably won't even need head cement!

NOTES:

- The colors used for this pattern are pretty typical for most midges that I see, but I will say that having some color options might not be a bad idea. I have seen olive, golden and black bodied midges so I'm thinking that these might be a good starting point.
- Hook choices are pretty simple but if you are wanting to them in really small sizes you may not be able to find curved "midge" style hooks in sizes smaller than size #22. For #24's and #26's you will probably have to use a standard "J" style hook like a Tiemco 100 or 101 (ring eye) or your favorite from another maker.
