Leader's Line...

Klamath River Dam Removal Project

ne of the first speakers I booked for our Club meetings was Brandon Worthington of Ashland Oregon. Brandon's talk was a guide's perspective on how the proposed removal of four dams would affect the Klamath River. This dam removal project, the largest ever proposed, is slated for June 2024. The dams to be removed are the Iron Gate, Copco 1-2 and JC Boyle. The project is not related to the dam and farming water issues we see in the rest of the state. These dams are primarily for power generation, so the lakes behind the dams are very shallow. The shallow water heats up in the summer and creates algae, degrading water quality.

I have fished and loved the lower Klamath for the last eight years, so Brandon's presentation got me

wanting to see and fish the Upper Klamath for myself. This summer Diane and I had a commitment in Bend, Oregon, and so we decided that while we were up there we would like to explore Central Oregon. We visited the Deschutes River, the Williamson, the Metolius, Crater Lake and the Umpqua, and finished with a week on the Upper Klamath. On the Upper Klamath we camped about four miles below the JC Boyle hydro

plant.

It was remote wilderness camping, and during our five-day stay we saw two other fishers and a few white-water rafters. Fishing was good, with the largest redband to hand around

15". For the last day of our trip, we hooked up with Brandon downriver for some white-water rafting and fly fishing. The day with Brandon was fun, full of

> fish and educational. Brandon explained that while the Upper Klamath has a great fish (redband) count per mile, it is extremely hard for the fish

to live over two or three years.

With the fluctuation of water levels and the degradation of water quality, the stress on the fish is great. He then explained how removing the dams will not only free access to Salmon and Steelhead travel but is going to restore function to the many cold-water springs and cold-water

tributary's that feed the river. These cold-

Fly Fishing Icon Gary Borger: "Fly Fishing the Non-Hatch Times"

MARC BONVOULOIR, 1ST VICE PRESIDENT

BCC is very proud to have Gary Borger as our September speaker. Rarely in the past few years have we had someone of his caliber speak to the Club. Gary will be with us the entire day on Thursday, September 29, first teaching a casting class starting at 9:00 AM (see accompanying article for details), then speaking at our normal monthly meeting that evening.

Gary has been fly fishing since 1955. He holds a B.S. and M.S. from Penn State University and a Ph.D. from the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He is a Professor Emeritus of Biology at the University of Wisconsin-Wausau. Over the years he has introduced thousands of people to the joys of casting and fly fishing through his lectures, books-ten best sellers, and hundreds of articles in all the major national fly fishing and related magazines. NYMPHING, NATURALS, THE BORGER COLOR SYSTEM, DESIGNING TROUT FLIES, PRESENTATION, FISHING THE FILM, READING WATERS, LONG FLIES, THE ANGLER AS PREDATOR AND FLY GEAR. **DESIGNING TROUT FLIES** was awarded "Book of the Year" by the Untied Fly Tyers, and PRESENTATION is considered by many to be the best one-volume book ever written on fly fishing.

Gary was the first person to release a fly fishing instructional video: "Nymphing" (1982). His book NYMPHING (1979—still in print after 40 years) and his "Nymphing" video were the first to discuss both the art and science of this angling form in the modern angling literature, and firmly established the basis of all current nymphing tactics.

He was the Midwest Director of the Fenwick Fly Fishing Schools (the first national fly fishing schools) from their founding in 1973 until the mid-1980s, when

the Fenwick company was sold. He then ran his own fly fishing schools for the next decade.

He is a recipient of the Ross Allen Merigold Complete



Angler Memorial Award, the Charles K. Fox Rising Trout Award, the Lee and Joan Wulff Conservation Award, The Buz Buszek Memorial Fly Tying Award, the Lifetime Achievement in Fly Casting Instruction Award from Fly Fishers International and is a member of the VFS Fly Fisherman Reader Poll Hall of Fame. Gary has been named as one of the 50 most influential fly fishers of the last 50 years by FLY FISHERMAN MAGAZINE, and as one of the seven most influential fly fishers of the last 50 years by FLY FUSION MAGAZINE (Canada's premier fly fishing magazine).

Gary's topic for our meeting is "Fishing the Non-Hatch Times." More than 90% of our fishing time is spent fishing during non-hatch periods, when fish are taking whatever food drifts or swims past. Learn the secrets of fishing these "hatchless" periods with consistent success using dries, nymphs, and long flies like leeches and minnow imitations.

Tf you are looking to improve your fly casting skills, then join the TEACH THE TEACHER class. Think of this class as a chance to learn to teach yourself.


Participants will learn to:


The fish at Crowley are big. Expect fish from 18 to 22", with typically a couple 24" or more.



It is a hopeful sign for the future that we can move forward with other difficult restoration projects to give our grandchildren a better world, wild places, and beautiful fish.









Fly of the Month: Hi-Viz Spinner

Over the years I feel that I've failed to address the importance of this stage of the life cycle of a mayfly. Yeah, I have preached (ad nauseam) about the importance of the Trico spinner phase but with that one exception, I have left the topic largely ignored. Well, this month I hope to extend your level of understanding a bit more.

The spinner (Imago) phase of a mayfly is its fourth and final. The insects are now sexually mature and, after mating, will soon die as they return to the river depositing themselves on the water. The females to lay their eggs thus continuing the cycle and the males...well probably because the water is nearby. The beauty is trout have a true boon in terms of feeding. A food source that won't and can't fly away so no wasted energy—easy pickin's. The fish rise up and down like yo-yos eating one or dozens with each mouthful. Until you have seen it you can't believe how many mouths are opening all over the river. The only thing you can do is to throw something at them that doesn't look too stupid, land it within inches of the fish, not allow it to drag on the surface and in perfect time with each rise and open mouth. Don't even think that these fish will move more than 12 inches out of the way to eat your superbly tied imitation—ain't gonna happen folks!

I am often reminded of evenings spent on the Madison River in August waiting for the nightly Pink Lady spinner fall. I would usually start fishing with a caddis or a small hopper imitation until I noticed consistent, repetitive rise forms near the bank. A quick change to a #14 spinner and I was in a very happy place until daylight faded. It's tough enough to see a small or even a larger pattern that is lying flat on the surface of the water in full daylight but, late in the day, it's dang near impossible. Also, if the spinner fall is heavy like with Tricos and Callibaetis, this fly will help you find your fly among all the naturals. At the end of the day your eyes will thank you that you tied some Hi-Viz Spinners.

If you want a list of patterns to tie check out Fred Arbona's book MAYFLIES, THE ANGLER AND THE TROUT. This book includes great information about imitating specific mayflies (East, Midwest and West) and lists the important *fishing* stages of each species' life cycles including sizes and colors of each part of their body that you, the angler and tier, should focus on. This makes it the perfect source for closely imitating every major mayfly genus and species in North America. So tie some Hi-Viz Spinners and have fun!

MATERIALS FOR TYING THE HI-VIZ SPINNER:

THREAD: 12/0 Veevus to match the natural

HOOK: Tiemco 100 in sizes 10 to 24 (I use a

Tiemco 101 ring eye for hooks smaller

than 16)

TAIL: Cog de'Leon or Hackle fibers in colors

to match the natural

BODY: Dubbing or thread to match natural.

THORAX: Dubbing (color to match natural)

WING: EP Triggerpoint Fibers tied flat to match



INSTRUCTIONS FOR TYING THE HI-VIZ SPINNER:

- 1. Place the hook in your vise and attach the thread and wind back to the end of the shank. Apply a small amount of dubbing to the thread. Wind 2 or 3 turns of the dubbing forming a small ball at the end of the shank which will help to split the tails. While there are other techniques for tying in split tails, this is probably the easiest.
- 2. Place the tail for the far side of the hook near the top of the shank. Use the tension of the thread to pull the tail into position along the far side of the hook. Now, place the near side tail near the underside of hook and again use the thread's tension to pull it towards you along the side of the hook. I like the tails to be longish: $1\frac{1}{4}$ to $1\frac{1}{2}$ the length of the hook shank. Dub your thread in a color that will match the color of the natural. Wind the dubbing forward creating a neat, thin abdomen.
- 3. Select wing fibers in a color to match the natural— usually white or a very light dun. The amount you use depends on the water type of the species you are matching. Slow water species, the wing is light and heavier than normal for faster water. Tie the wing material at the thorax and perpendicular to the shank using X-wraps. Finish with the thread behind the wing and do not trim to length yet.
- 4. Dub your thread for the thorax and wind a couple of turns behind the wing and then at least one or more full X-wraps over the wing. Finish winding the dubbing in front of the wing leaving a small space for the Hi-Viz material and head.
- 5. Now select a section of Hi-Viz fibers. Use bright orange for day time or black for dusk or evening. Using a loose loop tie in your Hi-Viz fibers over the top of the thorax and about the same length as the each of the spinner wings. Carefully cut away the butt ends and wind a small head covering the butts and whip finish. Grab both spinner wings and the Hi-Viz fibers between the thumb and



forefinger and pull them straight back over and beyond the body. Trim all of them at the same time with one cut where they line up with the bend of the hook.
